The date is easy to remember. The place is hard to forget.

Where the wooded hills of the Sussex Weald stretch down and touch the sea of England's south coast, you'll find 1066 Country. Set deep in history, its ancient settlements nestle in a rich landscape of woods, marshes, shorelines and horizons. Yesterday's traditions meet today's thriving art and music scene, while castles and forts tell timeless stories of invasion and conquest.

Despite its feeling of seclusion, 1066 Country is living proof that a breath of fresh air doesn't need to mean a long journey. On a direct rail route from London, it's less than 90 minutes from the big smoke, making it a perfect, easy escape.



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BEXHILL – RETRO ON SEA

The resort that built itself an iconic Modernist pavilion. Designed for the people, the De La Warr Pavilion is now a creative hotspot for contemporary culture on Bexhill's elegant seafront. A classical colonnade lines the long promenade and frames broad views across the bay to Beachy Head. Bexhill was first promoted as a fashionable resort at the turn of the twentieth century, with its extended promenade offering the perfect location for the first motor car races. It was also one of the first resorts to allow men and women to swim together on the same beach. Today, the town continues to innovate, sympathetically mixing the old with the new. Shop for preloved fashion and the latest vinyl records, and discover independent cafés and restaurants that defy traditional seaside stereotypes.

BATTLE – UNFOLDING ENGLAND'S STORY

Named after the most famous conflict on English soil, this compact market town grew up alongside the battleground. Its tranquil medieval abbey, Norman church and the surrounding ancient woodlands are largely unchanged to this day. Celebratory bonfires and battle re-enactments, plus an annual festival of contemporary arts and music, are all features of its enduring heritage. Stretching out before the abbey's crenellated walls and arched entrance, the high street is a bustling mix of independent businesses. Gift boutiques, cosy pubs and cafes jostle alongside designers representing the best in British sustainability. Hop off the train just before Battle to visit the picturesque village of Robertsbridge.

HASTINGS - SALTY SEA DOG

Set between hills that reach to the sea, Hastings lights up many lives: traditional fishing fleet, seaside resort, winding Old Town and edgy creative outpost. All looked upon by Britain's first Norman castle. An alternative art and music scene is a big draw for both the town and its neighbour, the adjoining St Leonards. These oysters come with their own grit, where modern rubs along with retro, rough edges with smooth corners: fish and chips on the beach, super cool galleries, subterranean skate park refurbished pier launching into the foam... and brilliant light on the horizon.

RYE – STYLISH COBBLED CITADEL

A medieval citadel huddled against invaders and the sea. Cobbled together over centuries, Rye reveals its history gently. Today its preserved Tudor and Georgian buildings are home to a myriad of art galleries, quirky attractions and cosy pubs, as well as modern boutique hotels and contemporary restaurants, serving the best Sussex has to offer. Home to smuggled secrets and timeless tales, Rye has nooks and crannies to explore and distant views across Romney Marsh to ponder. Reach to the tip of the estuary and you find Rye Harbour, its saltmarsh and shingle shore a haven for wildlife, wide open to the wind and sea.

BODIAM – FABLED FORTRESS OF THE WEALD

Bodiam's fame rests on its 14th century storybook moated castle. Once guarding a wider Rother estuary, it is now securely inland, in a romantic valley setting. Approach it by steam train, river boat or kayak, as well as by road. Beyond its medieval splendour, Bodiam was once renowned for hop cultivation and played a crucial role in the brewing industry, particularly for Guinness. The river meanders through the landscape, providing opportunities for fishing, boating and wildlife spotting. Combine visits to nearby gardens and organic vineyards with award-winning glamping or camping experiences.

CAMBER – SANDS ACROSS THE DUNES

Nowhere on the south coast is quite like Camber. Backed by a diverse ecosystem of dunes and wildlife habitats, it spreads its broad sands far out to sea. This Site of Special Scientific Interest is home to rare plants, insects and bird species. Inviting in the height of summer, invigorating in the depth of winter. Camber can be a place of solitude for yoga and evening strolls or an exciting backdrop for beach games. Join the kite and windsurfers, hire an e-bike, build sandcastles or simply take a moment to breathe it all in.

WINCHELSEA – HISTORY IN GRIDS AND SQUARES

Get lost in Winchelsea, England's smallest town, where the streets have no names. This ancient town of the Cinque Ports is set high on its Sussex hill, with panoramic views of the English Channel and in close proximity to the coast. Once a major hub for the medieval wine trade and a sea port of national importance, now landlocked, Winchelsea was originally established in the 13th century by Edward I. Its chequer pattern construction conceals hidden vaults and medieval wine cellars beneath. Today there's a sense of calm, order and quietness preserved in its streets and buildings. Visit St Thomas' Church and you'll be surprised who you come across in its grounds.

A village with many claims to fame – moated castle, former Royal Observatory, science centre and home of the Sussex trug. Herstmonceux, with its telescope domes, windmill and castle turrets, sits modestly between Wealden hills and marshy levels, its eyes on the skies and its feet on the ground.

1066 COUNTRY WALK

The 31-mile 1066 Country Walk leads you gently through a landscape that witnessed the Battle of Hastings and whose castles and culture bear testimony to the Norman conquest. Starting at the landing place of William of Normandy near Pevensey Castle, it passes Herstmonceux Castle, the historic 1066 Battle Abbey and Battlefield, medieval Winchelsea and ends in the picturesque citadel of Rye.

The High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty surrounds you, a typical medieval landscape of rolling hills, valleys and vineyards, with cosy pubs and cafés along the way. Ten sculptures on the route are inspired by the Bayeux Tapestry and there are places for you to spend the night and wake fortified for the next few miles!
